

"Now the Q Exchange study is drawing to a close I would like to thank all those participants who gave so willingly of their time and also the staff at Q who have been so supportive throughout. The study has raised awareness of the contribution of UK community hospitals during the pandemic and our case studies demonstrate the tremendous creativity and flexibility demonstrated by many teams. We have been publishing the results in peer reviewed journals, presented findings at international conferences and set in motion a series of learning events through a Q Exchange Special Interest Group."

#### **COMMUNITY HOSPITALS SIG: SHARING GOOD PRACTICE.**

We have created a network within the Q Community. By the end March 2023 we had 53 members of our Special Interest Group. In 2022/2023 we held 5 discussion groups and produced 2 Resource Packs.


