Doctors from Japan visit Community Hospitals in Gloucestershire



We were pleased to be approached by Doctors in Japan who wanted to visit some of our community hospitals. Thankfully, Gloucestershire Health and Care Trust was pleased to host this study visit and arranged from them to visit Tewkesbury Community Hospital and North Cotswolds Community Hospital. Hannah Williams DiPC Deputy Director Nursing, Therapies and Quality and Jan Marriott, Non-Executive Director were among the senior Trust staff to greet them, and arranged for hospital managers to take them on a tour of the facilities and give them an opportunity to talk to staff

directly. Staff had rehearsed the Japanese word for hello and welcome which was appreciated.

Drs Honda, Osugi and Yoshida were impressed with the hospitals and drew comparisons to Kaita hospital where they work. Dr Honda has set up an Association of Community Hospitals for the 20 community hospitals in Japan. CHA Continues Collaboration with End of Life Coalition

The CHA continues its partnership with the Coalition of Frontline Care for People Nearing the End of Life, working the Goro England the British alongside organisations such as Care England, the British Geriatrics Society, and The Gold Standards Framework Centre. The coalition advocates for enhanced end-of-life care training for the UK's three million frontline healthcare workers.



In their 2023 open letter to health ministers, they emphasised the need for integrated end-of-life care planning through new Integrated Care Boards and increased CQC focus on end-of-life care. A notable success story includes four Cornwall Community Hospital wards recently receiving GSF accreditation for excellent end-of-life care delivery.

With an aging population, the CHA and its partners view this as an opportunity to make end-of-life care knowledge fundamental to frontline training. This approach aims to reduce acute hospital pressure, improve patient outcomes, and enable more people to receive care in community settings. The CHA and NHS Benchmarking

The CHA is continuing its valuable partnership with NHS Benchmarking to enhance the understanding and data quality of intermediate care services. Community hospitals, which provide over three-quarters of bed-based intermediate care services, play a crucial role in supporting patient recovery, rehabilitation and transitions from acute care settings. However, collecting and analysing comprehensive data from these facilities has historically proven challenging.

A significant event is scheduled on Tuesday 17th December (2 - 4PM) to review and discuss new findings and insights in intermediate care. The

CHA is committed to ensuring that data accurately reflects the essential services provided by community hospitals, particularly their unique value in integrating care across different settings and supporting discharge processes.

The CHA actively seeks input from members and hospital representatives to help shape future data collection methods and project development. This collaboration with NHS Benchmarking represents an important step towards making community hospital services more visible and measurable within the broader healthcare system.

Those interested in attending the event, speaking, or contributing ideas for project development are encouraged to contact the CHA. Together, we can advance the effectiveness of community hospitals through robust data collection and analysis.



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News

The <u>CHA collates news articles</u> on community hospitals from a range of sources such as notifications from our members and from media coverage. Please do send in any news items that you would like us to share with CHA members.

There is news of a new community ward at <u>John Coupland Hospital</u> in Gainsborough, Lincolnshire. The new 17-bed Scotter ward, which includes a palliative care suite and stroke beds, is intended to prevent patient admissions to larger hospitals.



Patients are now able to access rheumatology care at Minehead Hospital for the first time this decade,

following the return of the specialty's outpatient clinics to the hospital.

In a recent visit to <u>East Lothian Community Hospital</u>, the Scottish Health Secretary Neil

Gray praised the "incredibly strong" work at the hospital.

Richard Foord MP for Honiton, Sidmouth and Tiverton, <u>published his views on the future of healthcare</u>, and cited excellent community hospitals across Devon such as in Axminster, Honiton, Ottery St Mary, Seaton and Sidmouth.

There is also news of repairs underway at <u>Okehampton Community Hospital</u> with support from the local Council, plans being challenged to close <u>Accrington Victoria Hospital</u>, and proposals to <u>open new community beds</u> in Stoke-on-Trent to help address waiting time issues.


